### Prayer Focus: Defence Force Chaplains

The Australian armed forces have employed Christian clergy to meet the spiritual & welfare needs of uniformed men & women on a full-time & part-time basis since the Boer War (1899-1902).

The ADF chaplain can be a bridge between the church & the Armed Forces as well as between an individual and God.

Chaplaincy is a ministry which encompasses all aspects of pastoral, vocational, instructional & administrative duties, in which the chaplain lives with & shares the hardships & privileges of uniformed men & women. The Presbyterian Church of Australia presently provides 11 full-time chaplains & 8 part-time chaplains, serving in all branches of the armed forces.

Please pray for the defence force chaplains & the men & women they serve:

-Give thanks for the ministry of Defence Force Chaplains through the years in times of peace and of war.

### Congregational Meeting 18 November

Following the church services in Orange on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> Nov there will be a congregational meeting to consider two matters:

1. Approving the financial arrangements for renewing Cath Read's contract for 2019. The proposal is that she be employed for 3 ½ days per week in 2019.
2. Approving mission budget arrangements for supporting the Cooke family in Vanuatu in 2019. The proposal is that the support which would have gone to Ps Maliwan for ministry in Sulphur Bay in 2018 & 2019 be given to the Cooke's support since Ps Maliwan is on leave from his pastoral duties for those two years. And an additional \$5,000 be provided to the Cooke's, so a total of \$10,000 will be provided from congregational funds to the Cooke's for 2019 ministry in Sulphur Bay, Vanuatu.
